## **Strategic Plan**

#### Vision

The BCFA and its member clubs will achieve increased participation in the sport of fencing at all levels. The BCFA and its member clubs will achieve increased success at the competitive level, including winning more medals at National and International Competitions and increasing the number of BCFA members on National Teams. The BCFA will secure funding from multiple sources, and will ensure that greater than 70% of revenue received is directed to the fencing community.

#### **Values**

The BCFA believes in six core values, which include the following:

- Promoting excellence
- Equal accessibility
- Safety for all participants
- Sportsmanship and fair play
- Responsive service to members
- Respect for sport of fencing
- Providing a safe environment for all participants
- Respecting diversity

### Goals

#### 1. Enhance Participation in Fencing

- **Outcome:** By 2028 the BCFA will have 1,500 competitive members and 5,000 developmental members on a sustainable annual basis.
- **Current State:** The number of BC fencers has grown over the last year, and we expect this number to continue to increase over the year to come.

#### 2. Competitive Excellence

- Outcome: By 2028, BCFA athletes will:
  - Win 20%–30% of the medal count at Canada Cup and Canadian National events on an annual basis
  - Medal at NAC events in every age category and every weapon on an annual basis
  - Have medaled at the Pan-American Championships at the Cadet, Junior and Senior level in every weapon category
  - Have medaled at World Cups at the Junior and Senior levels
  - Have medaled at the World Championships at the Cadet, Junior and Senior levels
  - At least one BC athlete will have qualified for the 2024, 2026 and 2028
     Youth Olympic Games
  - At least two BC athletes will have qualified for the 2023 and 2027 Pan-American Games
  - At least one BC athlete will have qualified for the 2024 and 2028
     Olympic Games
  - Comprise the majority of the Senior men's and Women's epee national teams.
- **Current State:** BCFA athletes continue to shine both on the national and international stages during the 2022/2023 season. Highlights from this past season include:







# Canada Cup #2 – Kingston, ON (Jan. 2023)

Gold: 2 Silver: 7 Bronze: 7








# National Championships – Longueuil, QC (May 2023)



#### 3. Increased Coaching Capacity

- Outcome: The BCFA will provide support and programs in order to increase the number of trained coaches at both the grass roots and competitive level. By 2028:
  - Every coach and official working with participants in B.C. will be trained and certified with the Canadian Coaching Association at a minimum level of community coach.
  - B.C. will have access to at least ten coaches trained at the Canadian Coaching Association competitive level and the BCFA will have supported these coaches in attending courses and gaining competitive experience at international competitions.
- Current State: A coaching clinic was held in conjunction with National Championships earlier this year. We also continue to pursue new initiatives to increase coaching in B.C. by promoting coaching workshops through our social media and website, as well as providing NCCP information and the CFF-specific coaching model on our website.

#### 4. Increased Official Capacity

- Outcome: The BCFA will provide support and programs in order to increase the
  number of trained officials such as referees, tournament managers, armorers
  and Directoire Technique staff. The BCFA will develop a training program to
  ensure BCFA members can become qualified as provincial and national level
  referees. The BCFA will use BCFA run competitions to train and provide
  experience for those interested in officiating in a variety of roles. BCFA will have:
  - 30 Provincially qualified referees
  - o 15 Nationally qualified referees
  - 5 FIE level referees
  - 5 Nationally qualified armourers
  - A cadre of 20 people well versed in event management and Directoire Technique responsibilities.
- **Current State:** The BCFA has continued to promote referee training programs when available, and aim to see more members attain referee status over the next year.

#### 5. Providing Competitive Opportunities for BC Fencers

- Outcome: The BCFA will continue to actively pursue event hosting opportunities
  at the national and international level. The BCFA will support and sanction local
  tournaments. By 2028 the BCFA Provincials Championships will be recognized as
  a major tournament throughout B.C., Western Canada and the Northwest
  United States, with an annual attendance of over 500 registrants by 2028. BCFA
  will have hosted National and International Tournaments, including an annual
  World Cup in both genders, and an event such as the Pan-Ams or World
  Championships.
- Current State: As of July, the 2023 Youth and Senior Provincial Championships have not yet been held. However, there is potential for both events to be held in the Fall. In December 2022, the BCFA hosted the 2022 Vancouver World Cup for men's and women's epee at the Vancouver Convention Centre. This was the first event of its kind to include both men's and women's epee events at the same World Cup. Top Canadian results include BCFA members Alexanne Verret (bronze medal, women's epee) and Dylan French (12<sup>th</sup> place, men's epee). In October 2022, the BCFA, alongside Dynamo Fencing Club and the CFF, helped host Canada Cup #1 in West Vancouver.

#### 6. Recognizing Contributions

- Outcome: The BCFA will recognize the contributions of its members, coaches
  and volunteers in a variety of ways, such as the annual Presidents' awards,
  recognition at World Cups, etc. The BCFA will be run by volunteers whose key
  skills are utilized, and who are valued and rewarded for their work. The BCFA will
  provide developmental opportunities and recognition for volunteers. The BCFA
  will nominate members for available awards (CFF or SportBC awards)
- **Current State:** Over the past year, the BCFA has brought on Elana Lancit as our new administrator. Her expertise and enthusiasm are invaluable assets to the BCFA team.

#### 7. Community Funding

- Outcome: The BCFA will not rely solely on core government revenue sources. The BCFA will secure funding through event hosting, fundraising, merchandising and grant opportunities. By 2028 the BCFA will continue to have annual revenue streams of \$300,000 per year, of which less than 50% will be from core government of BC operating agreements.
- **Current State:** Revenue for the 2022/2023 fiscal year was \$316,113 compared to the \$118,615 in the prior year. \$280,252 of this came from public grants, while the remaining \$35,861 was received through memberships and registration fees.

#### 8. Market Fencing to Members of the Public

- Outcome: The BCFA will actively market the sport using a range of media avenues. By 2028 most BC residents will know about fencing and understand it to be a life-long sport that promotes a healthy active lifestyle. Every success at Provincial, National and International level will result in a BCFA press release.
- Current State: Fencing programs have continued to be offered within BC schools
  as a form of Physical Education. There are three credit courses, combining
  didactic and physical education components, available for students who take the
  sport through school programs. The BCFA continues to promote fencing through
  our social media outlets of Facebook, Twitter and our recently added Instagram
  account.
